Assistance Animals


Being an outdoor walking trail experience, assistance animals are welcome, as long as it is certified as a trained assistance animal or is an approved assistance animal.

Wheelchair access

Changing Places

Changing Place bathrooms are located in three locations across Mandurah. A Changing Place is a secure and clean bathroom specifically designed for people who need space and assistance to manage their bathroom needs while in the community and for whom universal access toilets are not suitable.


Mandurah Visitors Centre

- 24-hour access with own MLAK key
- MLAK Key: YES, Shower: YES
- An MLAK key can be borrowed from the Mandurah Visitor's Centre 7 days a week between 9:00am - 4:00pm. It is best to make a prior arrangement by contacting the Visitor Centre.
- Eligible Mandurah residents may be provided with a key for ongoing use.
